This grant will fund course resources and an author visit to support a new full year course offering for 12th graders entitled "YA Literature: Diverse Voices" where students will challenge the focus on normative identities in literature. The following is the course description that appears in Needham High School's Program of Studies:

In this full-year, 12th grade English course, students will explore literary narratives written for and/or marketed to young adults. Students will read and analyze contemporary young adult (YA) novels that are diverse in authorship, protagonists, themes, and genres, with specific attention given to the voices of those who have been marginalized or ignored. Texts will include complex human dilemmas, along with compelling, disconcerting characters, and challenge readers to re-examine their understanding of the world. This is a single block, four credit course that fulfills the senior year English requirement.

Grant funds will be allocated towards acquiring new course titles, along with three instructional volumes aimed at enhancing students' learning experience. I am seeking texts to aid in creating a curriculum map that fosters student empowerment and expands opportunities for students to appreciate the significance of diverse voices and experiences. The author visit funds will offer students a unique opportunity to delve deeper into themes, perspectives, and the motivations behind the work. It also provides a platform for students to ask questions, show their insights, and connect personally with the author's message, thereby creating a richer and more meaningful learning environment.

Graphic novels serve as an invaluable resource for fostering literacy skills, critical thinking, creativity, and cultural awareness among students. When studying a work like Laura Dean Keeps Breaking Up With Me, students will be able to investigate representations of girlhood in YA literature and LGBTQIA+ representation, and Lunar New Year Love Story will allow students to investigate the challenges for refugee and immigrant families. Firekeeper's Daughter and Saints of the Household will give students the opportunity to explore the lack of Indigenous and Latinx representation in mainstream YA literature and popular culture. Saints of the Household, written in verse, provides students with a new way into the curriculum. These texts not only provide diverse perspectives and enhance engagement but also promote accessibility because of the unique and multimodal format.

The three teaching volumes will help students gain a deeper understanding of multicultural YA literature and develop enhanced skills for critically evaluating and appreciating the complexities of diverse narratives.

Furthermore, I aim to obtain funding to facilitate an author visit with Ari Tison, author of Saints of the Household. This visit will provide a space for students to talk directly with the author to discuss Indigenous and Latinx representation, how different genres and narrative styles attract a wide range of readers, and the power of the verse novel in YA literature.

This course incorporates a variety of perspectives and encourages student choice with a culturally responsive approach. It serves as an excellent means to validate the identities and voices of all students.

The following are the course's objectives, with a focus on the Portrait of a Needham Graduate competencies:

- Explore the history of YA literature and some of the contemporary issues within the field, such as representation and censorship, to raise questions driven by curiosity and become creative thinkers and problem solvers.
- Determine the potential that different genres and narrative styles have to attract a wide range of readers within YA and work to articulate our own ideas using a variety of communication strategies and skills.
- Read diverse YA novels through a sociocultural analytical lens and think critically about how the texts speak to representations of identity/ies, single and counter stories, stereotypes, privilege and marginalization to become socially and culturally responsive contributors.
- Analyze the characters within YA novels and how they overcome physical and emotional challenges to then reflect on our own personal choices as they relate to being responsible and resilient individuals.
- Gain a deeper understanding of YA literature's potential to validate various ways of existing in society by reading, collaborating, and leaning into self-directed learning to become empowered learners.
